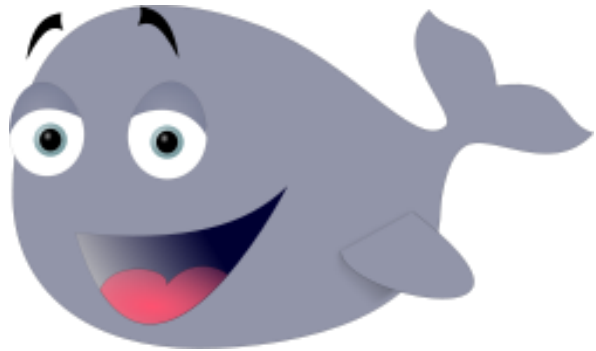

my sidewalk.

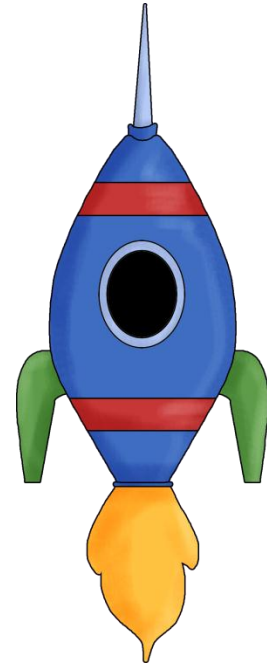
FACT or OPINION

planet.

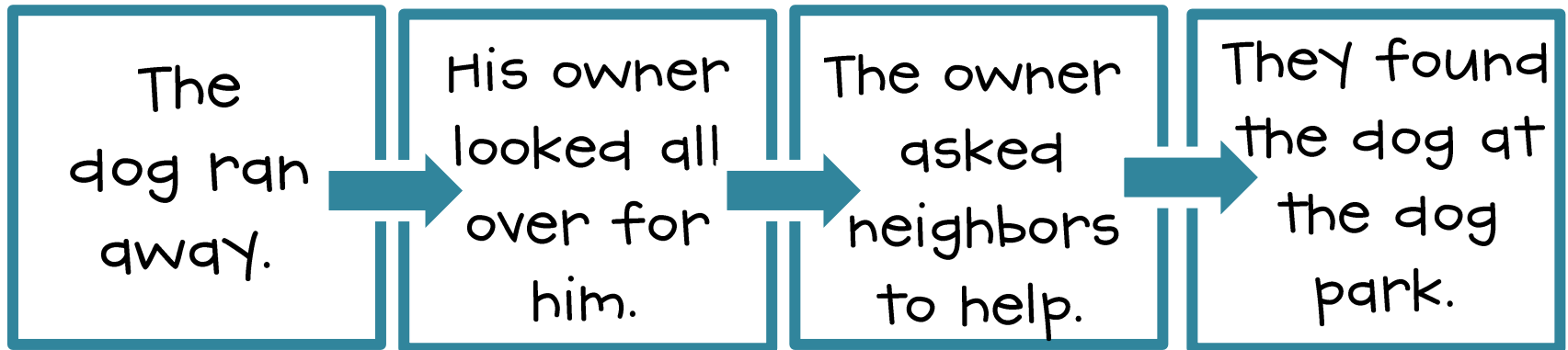

PRIOR KNOWLEDGE

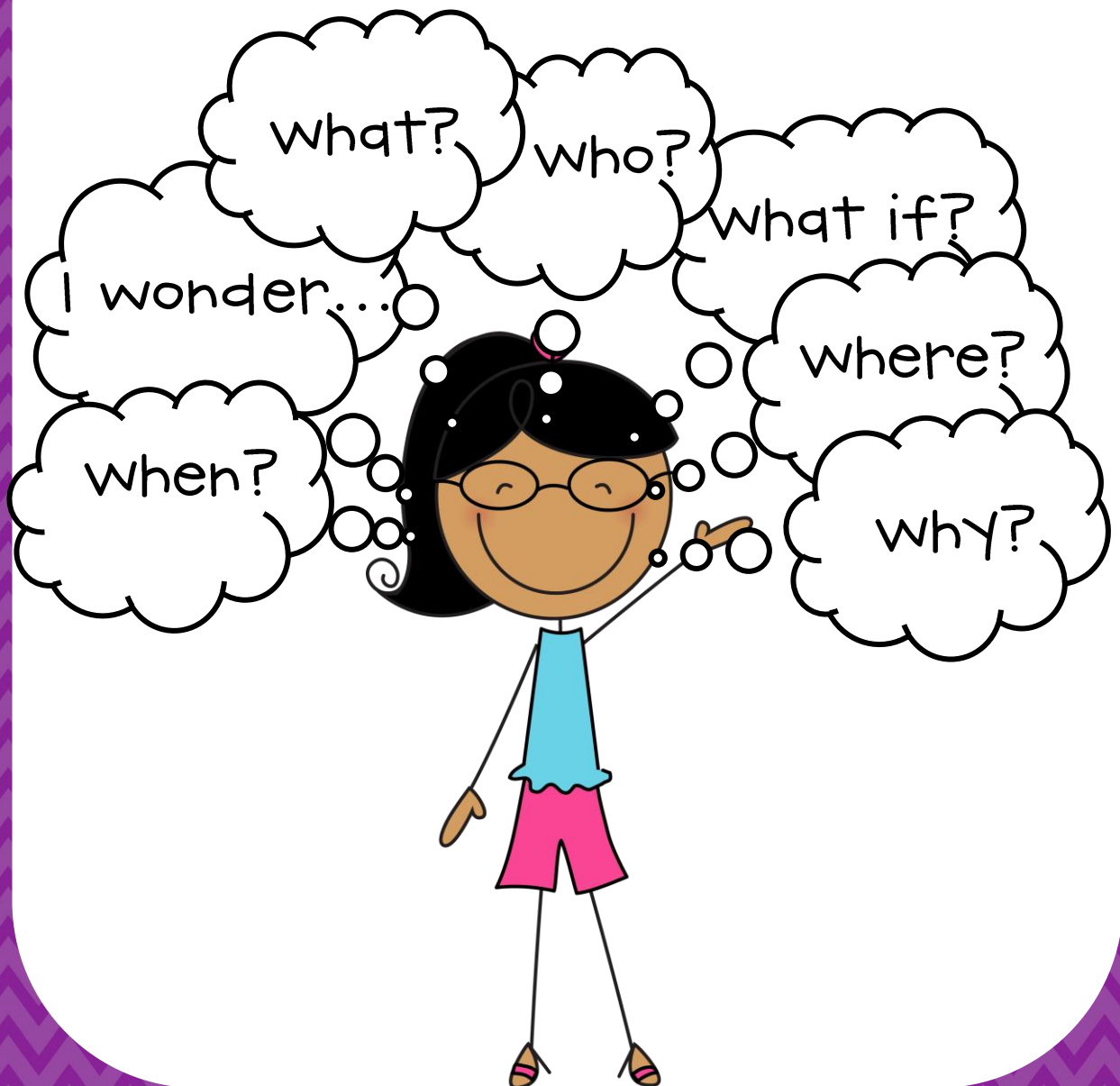
use what I already know to

make connections between different things I read



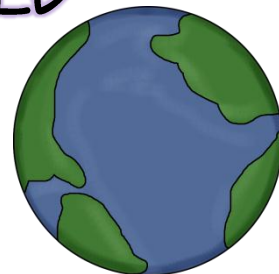

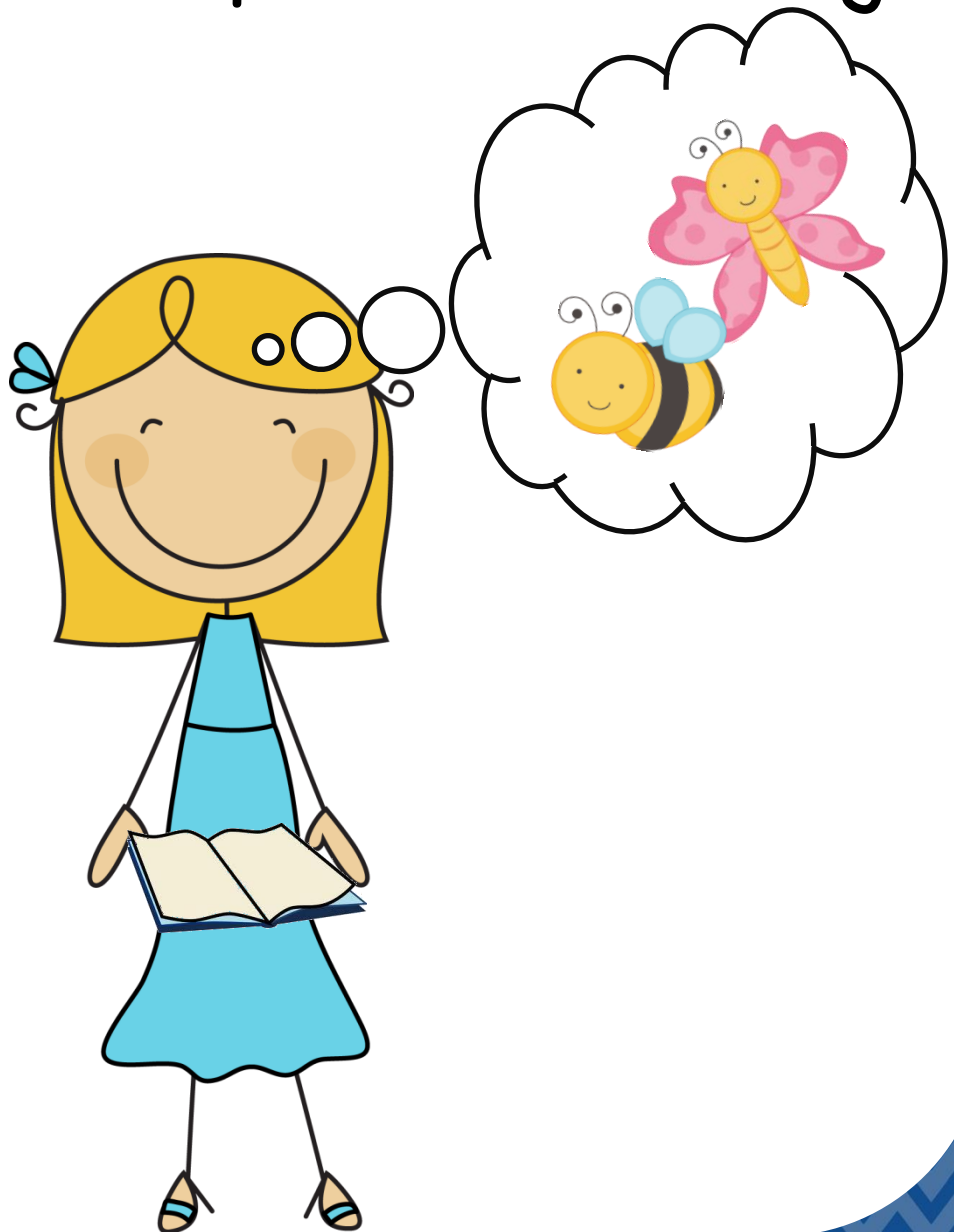

VISUALIZING

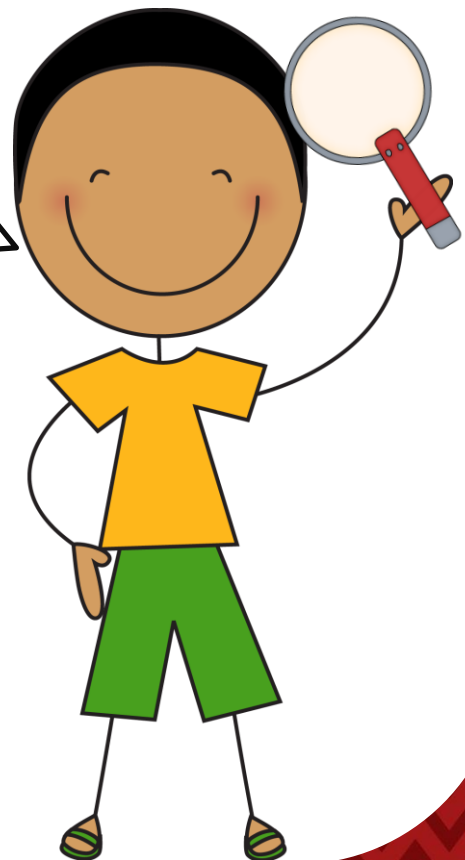
to create a picture in your

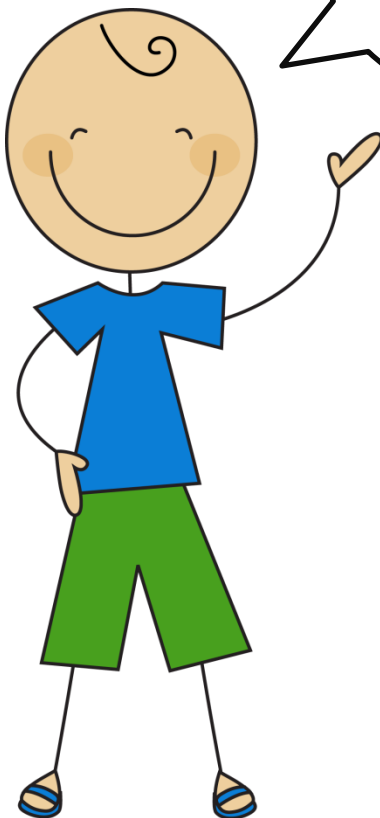


SUMMARIZING

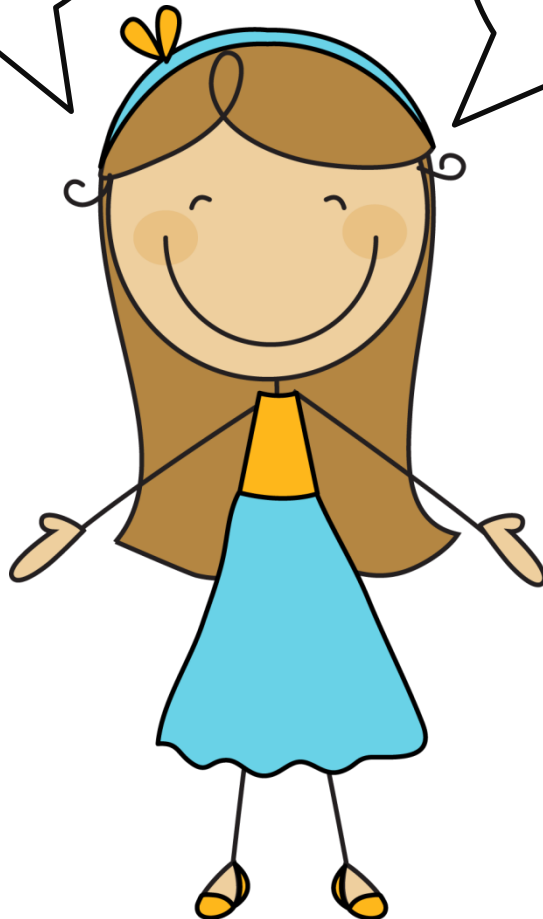


EVALUATING

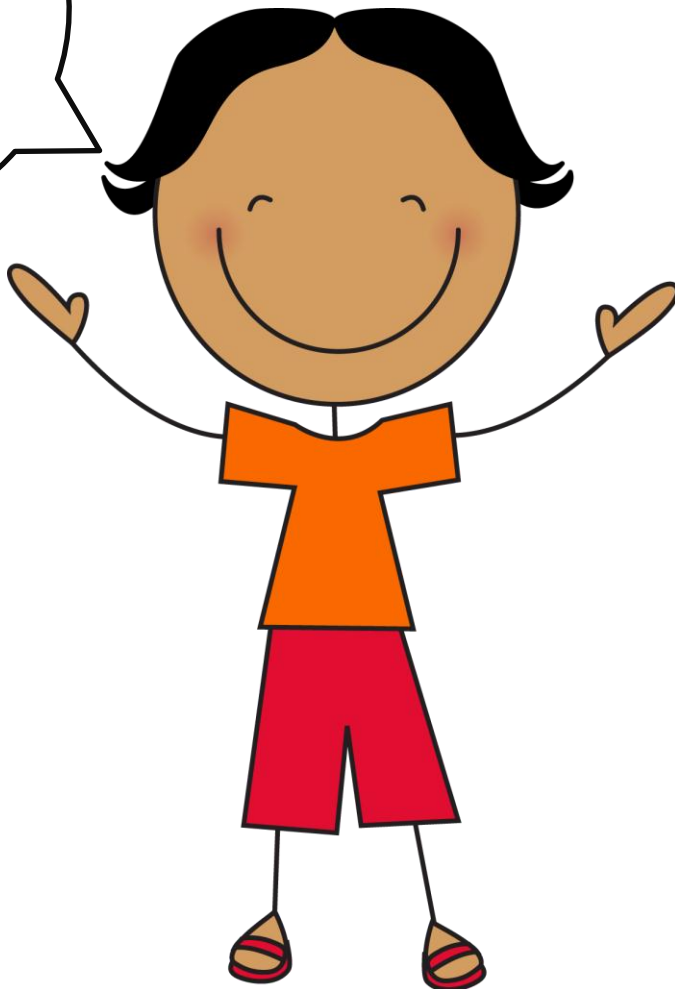
