

There are a total of 30 cards. Pass out all cards to the students. If you have less than 30 students, you will need to have some students take more than one card. Find the student that has the <u>"start here, end here"</u> card. This student will only read out the "start here" portion of his/her card to begin the game.

The game continues as students listen for the card the precedes their own. For example, if a student reads out "who has an opinion about dikes?" The student who has the card that says "I have: dikes are scary" would stand to read out their card.

The game is complete when the final (lue brings the game full (ircle back to the beginning student with the final "who has a fact about elephants?" (ard). The student who started the game will then read their "I have: Elephants have trunks. Encourage students to pay close attention the whole game so that they don't miss their turn. The game should be quick! You may also choose to collect and redistribute (ards and play again for more practice.















There are a total of 28 cards. students place all cards upside down in the center of him/her and the partner. provide each student with a recording sheet.


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
2. The students try to find a fact and opinion match about the same topic. For example, "dogs make great pets" and "dogs stand on 4 legs" is a match because both cards about the topic: dog. It is the student's job to decide which card is a fact about dogs and which card is an opinion about dogs.



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





There are a total OF 12 fact and Opinion cards. Students read each card and decide if the sentence states a fact or expresses an opinion.

2. students record whether the card is a fact or an opinion on their recording sheet.

Finally, the student will "Switch UP" the fact or the opinion. For example, if the card states a fact about a dog, a student will then come up with an opinion about a dog and write it down on their recording sheet.
